If you would like to dig deeper into some of the themes associated with *OLD STOCK*, here are some local and international organizations doing work on human rights, humanitarian aid, immigration, inclusion and beyond:

LOCALLY:

The PEI Association for Newcomers to Canada

PEIANC is a non-profit charitable organization with a mandate to provide short-term settlement services, and long-term inclusion and community integration programs for new immigrants in the province of Prince Edward Island. Based in Charlottetown, the organization administers language testing interpretation programs, employment assistance services, youth settlement services for school-aged children, cultural inclusion training, and other community engagement programs.

OTHER CHARITIES:

United Nations Refugee Agency

The UNHCR coordinates UN refugee responses, including support for host countries providing assistance for refugees.

International Organization for Migration

The IOM is an intergovernmental organization which provides services and support to governments and migrants.

Unicef Canada

The United Nations Children's Fund is a child-focused humanitarian organization operating in 192 countries.

Doctors Without Borders

Doctors Without Borders, or Médecins Sans Frontières, operates medical facilities inside countries like Syria and supports more than 100 clinics, health posts, and field hospitals in the country.

Oxfam

Oxfam is an international confederation of 17 organizations working around the world to find solutions to poverty and support human rights.

Amnesty International

Amnesty International is a non-governmental organization with a focus on human rights.

Canadian Red Cross

Part of the international humanitarian organization Red Cross/Red Crescent, the Canadian Red Cross is helping to support the efforts of the Syrian Arab Red Crescent in Syria.
