Dress Code and Program Policies September 2022

Studio Etiquette

It is very important that students arrive **early** for classes, **properly dressed** and with **hair tied back** off the face. **Consistent attendance** is also extremely important so the class can progress together and not get slowed down reviewing material already covered. We ask you to please keep us informed regarding absences as students who miss too many unexcused classes may be asked to withdraw from the program, please contact our administrator at dance@confederationcentre.com if you know your student will be absent from class.

Dress Code

Please view the following dress requirements for students. Students must wear form fitting clothes to class for safety, loose clothing restricts our instructors from accurately assessing body alignment which may lead to improper technique or even injury, please dress appropriately for classes. Students who are not dressed appropriately may be asked to observe for their own safety. Warm-ups may be worn at the discretion of your instructor.

CREATIVE MOVEMENT:

- Bodysuit or close fitting t-shirt; tights, leggings, or jazz pants (tutus welcome)
- O Bare feet, gymnastic slippers, ballet slippers (students wearing footed tights must wear ballet slippers to prevent slipping)
- O Hair must be tied back off the face

BALLET:

- Solid colour bodysuit (preferably black, but not required); ballet-pink tights
- Pink ballet slippers
- O Hair must be tied back off the face, in a bun for Intermediate I and higher.
- Non-binary and male identifying close-fitting t-shirt; shorts or leggings, black/white/pink ballet slippers

JAZZ & DANCE FOR HEALTH:

- Bodysuit or close-fitting t-shirt; tights, leggings, shorts or jazz pants
- Gymnastics slippers, Jazz shoes, or bare feet.
- Hair must be tied back off the face

MUSICAL THEATRE:

- Bodysuit or close-fitting t-shirt; tights, leggings, shorts or jazz pants
- Gymnastics slippers, or Jazz shoes (students are encouraged to have jazz shoes as they will need them
 for the end of term performances. We do have a limited supply available for loan during performances
 on a first-come first-served basis).
- Hair must be tied back off the face
- Face masks are mandatory for the voice/drama portion of class. Masks which extend out from the face are preferable to allow for proper pronunciation and vocalization.



- o Bodysuit or close-fitting t-shirt, leggings, or jazz pants
- Socks, bare feet, or foot undeez.
- Hair must be tied back off the face
